KAVHA Cultural Landscape Management Plan: Update

The Cultural Landscape Management Plan (CLMP) is designed to guide the landscape and precinct management at Kingston and Arthur's Vale Historic Area (KAVHA). This key supporting document for KAVHA has now been finalised, and is available at www.kavha.gov.au/projects.

The Department of Infrastructure, Transport, Cities and Regional Development appreciated the extensive feedback received during community consultation in 2018 and 2019.

Community input has shaped the final plan. A Consultation Outcomes Report which responds to specific feedback on the CLMP can also be found at www.kavha.gov.au/projects.

The CLMP includes a large number of recommendations, many of which are expected to be put in place in coming years.

Recommendations cover a broad range of landscape issues including water, vegetation, traffic and livestock management.



There will be a staged approach to implementation and in many cases, there will be opportunities for further community involvement on projects as work is progressed.

It is important to note the recommendations from the report's authors, consultants GML Heritage + Context, are not directions and are not set in stone. They will instead inform and guide the long term management of cultural heritage in the Kingston area.

The CLMP applies to the whole KAVHA site, as defined by the World Heritage Listing boundary.
